Participants gathered from across USA, Lebanon, Chile, South Africa, Bolivia, Malaysia, Kenya, DR. Congo, India, Japan, Philippines, Brazil, Hungary, Thailand, Haiti, Mexico, United Kingdom and Burundi to renew their spirit, interact with global servants and mission partners, build lasting relationships and explore ways we can participate in God's Great mission.

God desires to use each of us in ways as distinct and unique from each other as are our faces and voices. The roles we each play in faithfulness to Jesus Christ are woven together in one master plan to bring healing and reconciliation to all of creation.

They all went to carry stones and mud and worked together to have it repaired.

Adija is very excited that for the next two weeks she has food to give her family. This is made possible through the team work of the women. Not only are we able to learn, but the basic needs that bring conflict in our homes are attended to. God bless PHARP.

On 25th and 26th; PHARP held two day discipleship training with 35 participants drawn from 4 churches that have been visited in Malindi (10 members from Baptist church, 5 from Spirit of faith, 15 from Rivers of healing and 5 from Kakoneni). In the four churches, discipleship groups have been formed with each having 10 members. Much thanks to the tSOAR discipleship material '*Finding your place in the World*', discipleship has progressed well and church members are appreciating the need to spend time with God through His word.

Pastor Maheli testified; for the last 5 months since I was trained and started using this material; I have seen a great change in my personal life. Because of spending time reading God's word, I have learnt new truths that I didn't know before. I am more confident in my preaching, because I have knowledge. It is amazing what discipleship can do: I introduced this book into our family devotions and this has brought my family closer. Our smallest daughter always reminds us to read the Bible before we sleep and this has brought peace and harmony within the family. My teenage son, who was becoming rebellious, is now towing the line. He is leading a youth discipleship group in our house every Thursday for one hour in the evening.
