## Salt and Light

You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven- Matthew 5:13-16

It is amazing to read and learn how God used the staff of Moses to perform miracles. Likewise, we learnt that we should not limit God by any means. He can make use of what we each have to solve our problems and those of others. On 27<sup>th</sup>: A new peacebuilding and discipleship class of training of trainers (TOTs) was launched in Kibera slum-Nairobi County. The location where the church is situated in within the AMREF grounds which is a hotspot for any type of violence, due to the many idle youths who abuse drugs and are unemployed. Every day the AMREF clinic near the church reports of many cases of abandoned infants every week; the pastor of the Redeemed church is not spared either. This class of 30 men, women and youth drawn from 6 neighboring churches seek to commit the first three months of the year being empowered and equipped to be better servant leaders as well effective peace ambassadors and disciple makers. These participants among others who will be trained throughout the year, will have comprehensive knowledge on personal growth and transformation in their walk with God, learn and understand the concept that encompasses, generates and sustains the full array of processes, approaches and stages needed to transform conflict toward more sustainable, peaceful relationships within families and communities. Kindly keep us in prayer for wisdom, strength and proper understanding on the part of the TOTs in order

to know how best to impact their communities regardless of all the challenges staring at them in the face.
